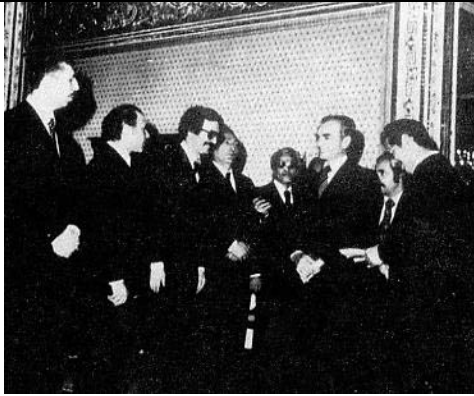

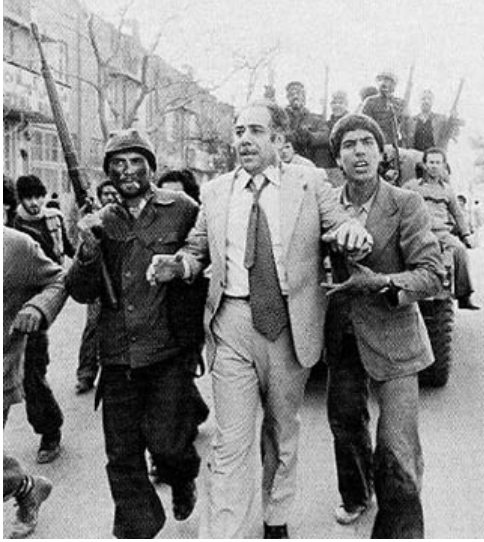
General Ali Neshat, last Commander of the Imperial Guard was executed by the revolutionaries in 1979



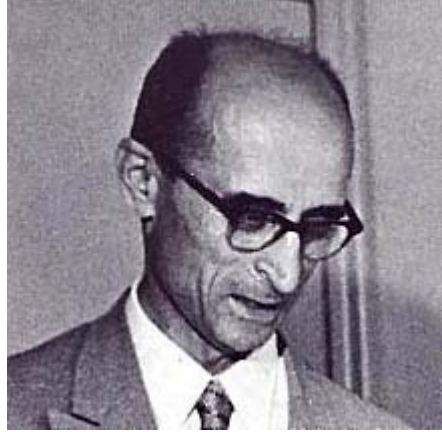
